Durable, functional, childproof, accessible, multi-stationed and big enough to accommodate 18 adults and their children all at once.


That's a preview of our design specifications for Family Shelter Service's kitchen in their new 15,000-square-foot building in Downers Grove.

Last year Family Shelter Service provided shelter from abuse and domestic violence to 313 women and children for a total of 11,821 nights of protection.



Project: Kitchen

Solutions: Removing a wall and creating an angular kitchen island that follows the lines of the room transformed an outdated kitchen into one up to the task of homeowner Ellen Liljiberg's frequent cooking. Storage steps up in a ceiling-to-floor cabinet with fabric-covered glass doors. Attention to details down to a new wrought-iron hand railing bring in a French country flair that suits the cook's—and the home's—style. The transfigured space is both highly functional and aesthetically pleasing. "Now it's a room I want to spend time in," says Ellen.

Solutions: To create a cooking and living space—a great room—that is now the home's pulse, Amy removed a wall and designed a kitchen that flows seamlessly into a previously unused living room/dining room. An angled island unites the original kitchen footprint with the living space, and European cabinets provide a sleek look complementing the contemporary decor. With clever added storage, cooking no longer entails trips to the basement for supplies. "We talked to other companies, but Drury Design was the most flexible and came up with the most innovative design," says homeowner Carol Scott.

Solutions: One of the problems in our old kitchen was a very large dining table that we very rarely used except as a landing place for school projects. When we ate dinner, I sat at the sink across the island from my family. We wanted to eat together at a table in our kitchen," Kim recalls. Relocating the oversized table and sending its collectibles packing into an attractive storage center opened up premium floor space in the new design. A substantial island shows off a built-in wine rack as it anchors an attached table. Playing off of traditional tones in a sleek and integrated gathering center, the design allows ample space for intimate family dining. Drama comes into play in the light and dark contrasts, setting the stage for lively entertaining. "Working with Lisa was a great experience. We're extremely happy and thrilled with the way our kitchen turned out," Kim says.
